Jeremiah 20:7-13

- ⁷ You deceived me, LORD, and I was deceived; you overpowered me, and prevailed. I am ridiculed all day long; everyone mocks me.
- ⁸ Whenever I speak, I cry out proclaiming violence and destruction. So the word of the LORD has brought me insult and reproach all day long.
- ⁹ But if I say,
- "I will not mention his word or speak anymore in his name," his word is in my heart like a fire, a fire shut up in my bones. I am weary of holding it in; indeed, I cannot.
- ¹⁰ I hear many whispering,
 - "Terror on every side! Denounce him! Let's denounce him!"

All my friends are waiting for me to slip, saying,

"Perhaps he will be deceived;

then we will prevail over him and take our revenge on him. "

- ¹¹ But the LORD is with me like a mighty warrior; So my persecutors will stumble and not prevail. They will fail and be thoroughly disgraced; their dishonor will never be forgotten.
- ¹² LORD Almighty,

you who examine the righteous and probe the heart and mind, let me see your vengeance on them,

for to you I have committed my cause.

- 1. If you had to give this section a title, what would you call it?
- 2. Read Jeremiah 20:1-6. What is Jeremiah complaining about?
- 3. Scan v. 7-10. Which one of Jeremiah's complaints have you thought before?
- 4. In what ways have you suffered for doing what God wants?
- 5. Agree/Disagree. It's a sin to complain to God.
- 6. Jeremiah's tone switches in verse 11. Explain why those words would be encouraging for Jeremiah.
- 7. Some Bibles call this section "Jeremiah's Confession," which means, "Jeremiah uncovers his heart." What was in Jeremiah's heart? (Try to name both positive and negative things.)
- 8. What in your heart is similar to Jeremiah's (both positive and negative)?
- 9. One mental pathway through suffering is from complaining to confessing to singing. What might move a person from complaining to confessing? What might move a person from confessing to rejoicing?
- 10. What is one thing you'll remember from this study?
