

God's Servant to Do Good to Others September 5-7th, 2020

Matthew 22:34-40

³⁴ Hearing that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, the Pharisees got together. ³⁵ One of them, an expert in the law, tested him with this question: ³⁶ "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"

³⁷ Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

- 1. *Incurvatus in se* refers to a person's life turned in and focused completely on itself. How have you seen that in our world?
- 2. How did the Pharisees exhibit the soul curved inward? (Scan Matthew 23 for hints.)
- 3. How might the Pharisee's question (v. 36) indicate self-centeredness?

- 4. List a few things that would be different about your average day if you "loved the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength."
- 5. Retell a few Bible stories where Jesus loves the Lord his God (and Father) with everything he's got.
- 6. In general, you know what's good for you. What are some things you do for yourself, which you could also do for your friends or family?
- 7. What things would be different about your average day if you *"loved your neighbor as yourself."*
- 8. Retell a few Bible stories where Jesus loves his neighbor as himself.
- 9. Agree or disagree: A Pharisee (someone obsessed with God's law) will be *BETTER* at keeping God's law than a Christian (someone who trusts Jesus to forgive all our sins.)
- 10. What's one way you can put into practice Jesus' commands this week?
