# Are you Ready?

This time of year, when someone asks you, "Are you ready?" they probably mean, "Have you finished your Christmas shopping yet?" For so many people, that's what it means to be prepared for Christmas. It means making sure you have your gifts purchased, your decorations up, and your Christmas cookies baked. Such activities are certainly appropriate for the holiday season. Faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ. (Romans 10:17)

It's how God will get you ready for what he has in store for you now, and in the future. Even if you never get all your Christmas decorations put up, you'll still be ready. You'll be ready, not only for the celebration of Jesus' first coming, but more importantly, you'll be ready for the reality of Jesus' second coming. Come, Lord Jesus!

# **Church Council Report from November 20, 2023 Meeting**

# Pastors' Report

<u>Pastor Zank</u>: Spent part of last week in New Ulm to meet with the leaders of Martin Luther College and share the support from the Conference of Presidents. Traveling in January to the Conference of Presidents meeting. <u>Pastor Raasch</u>: Spent a couple days at synod to provide updates on ministry in Asia. The pastors are visiting the Mount Olive shut-ins to fill in for Jerry Evansen while he is out. Pastor is working on filling the 2024 Mount Olive board vacancies.

<u>Pastor Priewe</u>: Advent Wednesdays start the week after Thanksgiving. The Mount Olive Pastors took educational classes at FVL in October. Pastor met with prospective new members from Fall Festival. <u>Pastor Gawel</u>: Presented at the Fox Valley youth night. Preparing for Christmas services, devotions, and related events.

# **Financial Report**

### Reviewed October 2023 financial report:

- October offerings were \$1,928 higher than budgeted.
- Tuition was \$12,718 lower than budgeted.
- Other income was \$6,449 lower than budgeted.
- Total income was \$17,239 lower than budgeted.
- Total expenses, before FVL/Synod distributions, were \$1,537 higher than budgeted.
- The net loss for October, including FVL/Synod distributions of \$29,600 was \$83,373. This compares to a budgeted net loss of \$64,597. The result is \$18,776 unfavorable to budget for the month.
- Note: Balance sheet amounts now include accrual balances.

# Reviewed YTD (18 weeks ending October 2023) financial report:

- Offerings are \$12,772 higher than budgeted.
- Total income is \$23,022 higher than budgeted.
- Total expenses are \$3,165 lower than budgeted.
- YTD net loss is \$27,568, which compares to the budgeted YTD loss of \$53,755. The result is \$26,187 favorable to budget.

# Forward in Faith 2 cost tracking update—Operations Manager Paul Kolell reported that:

- total receipts for November 2020 through October 2023 (the full 3 years of the FIF2 campaign) were \$2,177,663. \$2,015,144 came from pledges and related offerings and \$162,529 came from other sources.
- member pledged receipts for the month were \$15,503. This brings the total to \$1,517,117 which is 91.8% of the total 3-year pledge amounts.
- funds received over the past three years allowed Mount Olive to pay off the entire cost of FIF2 construction (about \$1.3M) plus pay down debt by an additional \$637K. Total school expansion costs between FIF1 and FIF2 was \$6.5M; by God's grace, Mount Olive has paid off more than \$5 million in construction costs over the past 6 years.
- at the end of October 2023 total Forward in Faith debt is \$1,460,381.

With Peter Joch at his term limit, Daryl Ohland has volunteered to become the chairman for the Board of Finance starting in January 2024.


