

Worship Theme – MISSION: Fish for People Sermon Theme – Compelled, new, and reconciled January 20-22, 2024

Il Corinthians 5:14-21 For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. ¹⁵ And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again. ¹⁶ So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. ¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! ¹⁸ All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: ¹⁹ that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. ²⁰ We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. ²¹ God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

- 1. What things are you totally all about and how do people know?
- 2. When are you compelled to do something? What is the best compeller there is??
- 3. What does it mean to see people as Jesus sees them, not as the world does?
- 4. Paul simply says in **II Corinthians 5:17** that if anyone believes in Jesus, that person is a new creation, the old is gone and the new is here. That's how it is, but what can you do if you don't feel that way, like a shiny, new creation?

- 5. It can be difficult to forgive. It can be even more difficult to accept that you are forgiven. Why is this? Care to share a real-life example?
- 6. What is reconciliation?
- 7. What makes reconciliation between people potentially difficult to achieve? Why is striving for it so important?
- 8. God makes us his reconcilers and his ambassadors, sending us out to seek, find, and save, to fish for people. Why did God entrust that all-important, that eternity giving work, to us?
- 9. What great exchange did God make with us and within us? Use **II Corinthians 5:21** to support your answer.
- 10. What's the hardest part of sharing your faith? What's the easiest part of sharing your faith?
