

Christians, You are Branches of the Vine April 27-29, 2024

John 15:1-8

¹"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes^[a] so that it will be even more fruitful. ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. ⁷ If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

- 2. In this section of Scripture, what words indicate that Jesus is speaking to believers?
- 3. In light of when Jesus spoke these words, why does he encourage his disciples to "remain in me"?
- 4. What application do those same words have for our lives today?

6.	Point out at least two promises that Jesus makes to/for those who remain in him.
7.	Agree/disagree: Whatever you ask of God, he will give you.
8.	Can you give an example of a time when God "pruned" you—and it produced more good fruit in your life? (e.g. took something away, allowed a hardship in your life, etc.)
9.	St. Paul writes, "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." (Gal. 5:22-23) Which fruit would you like to see more of in your life? How can/will God produce that fruit in your life?
