**Isaiah 53:10-12** Yet it was the Lord's will to crush him and cause him to suffer, and though the Lord makes his life an offering for sin, he will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the Lord will prosper in his hand. <sup>11</sup>After he has suffered, he will see the light of life and be satisfied; by his knowledge <sup>11</sup>my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities. <sup>12</sup>Therefore I will give him a portion among the great, and he will divide the spoils with the strong, because he poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors. For he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

1. Why was it God's will to "crush" his own Son? How does that demonstrate his love for us?
2. What does Isaiah 53:11 mean when it says Jesus "will see the light of life and be satisfied," and how does that shape our understanding of our salvation?
3. How does Jesus' sacrifice define the life we live as Christians?  
**Galatians 2:20** says, "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me."
4. What does it mean to live a life of sacrifice, and how does it mirror Jesus' willingness to suffer for us?

5. How does the example of Jesus washing the disciples' feet illustrate what it means to sacrifice and serve in love?
6. What does it mean to "forego personal rights" for the sake of the gospel? How does doing this display God's grace and his image?
7. Why is humility crucial in living out the love of Christ, especially towards those who may oppose us?
8. How does the image of Jesus interceding for transgressors, like **Isaiah 53:12** talks about, offer comfort and assurance in our daily lives as Christians?
