Introduction – Compassion Ministry: A Dangerous Thing

We know Jesus commands us to love our neighbor, especially those in need. We have three huge reasons to do so:

I. <u>It's the "royal law" found in Scripture.</u>

James 2:8, "If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, 'Love your neighbor as yourself,' you are doing right." James cites **Leviticus 19:18**, "Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against one of your people, but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the LORD."

II. It's a fruit of the Spirit working in our hearts.

Consider Tabitha in **Acts 9** who was full of good works and the woman of noble character of **Proverbs 31** who opens her arms to the poor and extends her hand to the needy to supply them from her resources her own hands accrued.

III. It's proof that God lives in us now and on Judgment Day.

Matthew 25:34, 40, "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world." ⁴⁰ The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.'"

 - John 13:35, "By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."
 - I Corinthians 8:1, "Now about food sacrificed to idols: We know that we all possess knowledge. Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up."
 - I Corinthians 13:13, "And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love." (EVEN MORE THAN FAITH!)
